IT Instructor-Manager Position

We are looking for an energetic, entrepreneurial, go-getter person to be hired as a Manager-Instructor (a dual role involving management duties and teaching IT courses) at the Laare Community Technology Centre, in Laare, Meru. The ideal candidate should have a strong technical background, some teaching background and some leadership experience. The centre is a nascent institution, whose foundation lies in the recognition of the huge potential for IT and other modern technologies to improve the economies of rural Kenyan communities. The ideal candidate is, therefore, expected to enable the centre grow and with it, the community around, through various outreach initiatives already started by the centre. Enthusiasm, commitment and initiative are some of the most important factors we will be looking for in the applicant pool.

Background of Centre

The Laare Community Technology Centre is a service institution whose primary aim is to increase general computer awareness and literacy in the Laare community by providing cheap, local and accessible training on the use of computers. Duties and Responsibilities

As a <u>main instructor</u>, the selected candidate will teach various IT courses including, but not limited to, fundamentals of IT, various application programs commonly used in the market, internet technologies and web design, programming, basic hardware trouble shooting. He/she will also be responsible for curriculum development and reviews, and student recruitment and evaluation.

As <u>a manager</u>, the selected candidate will work with the centre's leadership team to oversee the overall management of the centre. However, the candidate will be directly in charge of the day-to-day running of the centre. He/she will perform basic maintenance of the centre's equipment and facilities, including basic troubleshooting and repairs of hardware and software issues. This role also includes handling all major communication involving the centre's local, national and international partners. The selected candidate will also be the team leader for other staff at the centre.

Oualifications

The ideal candidate will have the following qualifications: At least a 2 year diploma/higher diploma in IT/Computer Science from a recognized college/university (a bachelor's/masters degree is an advantage).

In addition to the basic salary, a performance based bonus will also be paid to the Manager-Instructor.
