Job Overview

Under the supervision of the Regional Director in Nairobi and in contact with the Director of Communication in Ottawa (Canada), you will act as a communications and public relations expert to increase the visibility of IDRC and its research partners in the Sub-Saharan Africa Region and in Canada. Your main responsibilities will be to participate in the development and implementation of a regional communication plan in line with IDRC's overall communication strategy; to provide advice to the Regional Director and program staff on public outreach strategies and how best to communicate research results; to organize communications and public relations activities to promote and disseminate pertinent research results; to coordinate media relations and liaise with key regional stakeholders and decision-makers; to develop and present communications and media products to share the research results; and to represent the Centre at various functions.

Among the essential qualifications, the ideal candidate will have:

- A Master's degree or equivalent experience in communication, journalism, popularization of science and
 with considerable experience in a research and/or international development environment <u>OR</u> a Master's
 degree in social sciences or international development with relevant experience in communications and/or
 journalism
- At least five years' track record of relevant communications and public relations work as well as experience in a research-related setting which includes: preparing and implementing communications plans to support program and project activities; identifying and analyzing issues to provide strategic advice regarding communications and public relations approaches, activities and products; building and maintaining collaborative relationships; developing, writing and implementing a wide range of communications and public relations products using a variety of media including multimedia, web and social media; organizing special events and activities to disseminate or promote program and project information and results; coordinating media relations, representing an organization and acting as a spokesperson; and working experience in French-speaking African regions is an asset
- English and French oral and written language skills at an advanced level
