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Admission Criteria

KAIST takes into consideration a number of factors when determining admission, including the candidate's academic achievements, potential, interpersonal skills, personal accomplishments, integrity, as well as leadership. For academic achievements, candidates are reviewed in context of level of studies completed in math and science classes, quality of achievements, and characteristics of institutions attended.

Admission Timeline

Applicants can choose to apply either Early Decision or Regular Decision. The only difference in Early Decision and Regular Decision is the deadline. The reason we have two application cycles is because it provides applicants with more options so they can choose which works best for them.

Admission Eligibility and Requirements

Please read the guideline carefully. As a candidate, it is your responsibility to know the application requirements, to submit the necessary materials by the deadline, and to monitor the status of application on the website.

Eligibility for Application

- International candidates must meet all of the following requirements:
 - He or she has graduated or will graduate from his or her secondary education by August 31, 2014.
 - 2) He or she is not a citizen of Korea.
 - * Korean citizens who hold dual citizenship are not eligible to apply as foreign students.

^{*} Materials must be received by the dates listed above.

^{**} Interview is NOT required for all accepted candidates. Candidates will be contacted if interview is necessary.



- International candidates of Korean origin MUST additionally satisfy one of the following two requirements:
 - 1) Neither of the candidate's parents is a Korean citizen or;
 - 2) The candidate must have received his/her entire elementary, junior high, and high school education outside of Korea at a comparable and equivalent level of those provided in Korea. But in this case, international schools located in Korea are not acknowledged as foreign schools.

 Candidates of Korean origin who completed their entire education (elementary, junior high, and high school) outside of Korea should submit the Certificate of the Facts Concerning the Entry & Exit issued by the Korean Immigration Office. The certificate should have recently been issued.

Application Documents in Detail

- .1) Application Form (original, online form)
 - · Complete application online (http://apply.kaist.ac.kr)
 - · Print it out and include it in the application package with other necessary documents.

2) Statement of Financial Resources (original, online form)

- The form can be found in the online application.
- Select KAIST scholarship, if you are not financially sponsored by government or organization.

3) Letters of Recommendation (original)

- · One recommendation letter is required.
- The recommendation letter should be written by homeroom teacher or math/ science teacher.
- · Print and submit the Recommendation Forms below.
 - Recommendation Form [ATTACHMENT 1]
- · Recommendations on official letterhead will also be accepted.
- Your teacher may send their recommendation letter directly to the admissions office.

^{*} International students of Korean origin who do not meet one of the eligibilities above CANNOT apply for International Admissions. Instead, they must apply for Korean Admissions. (http://admission.kaist.ac.kr/web/under/intro_d)



- Letters should be signed and sealed across the back of an official envelope by the recommenders.
- · Photocopies or recommendation letters via email are not accepted.

A) Transcript (copy)

- · You are required to submit transcripts from each high school (and college) attended.
- Transcripts must include year by year record of all coursework from last three years of upper secondary school. The last year coursework in process should also be included.

5) Standardized Official Test Scores (copy)

- Official Test Score Reports such as SAT1, SAT2, ACT, GCE A-Level, IB, AP, NCEA, high school leaving exam, university entrance exam, or other nationally/internationally recognized exam results should be submitted.
- · Official test results could be sent directly from the testing agency to KAIST.
 - Institution Code of KAIST for SAT score report: 4433
- You may attach a separate sheet to explain the exam procedure, competition rate, results, etc.
- · Certificate of National or International Olympiad can replace Official Test Score.

6) Certificate of Official English Proficiency Test (EPT) (copy)

- · Candidates whose official language is not English must submit the EPT certificate.
 - Exemption requirement: Candidates whose official language is English and completed 3 years of high school in English speaking country are exempt from submitting the EPT certificate. English Lecture Certificate is required for those who studied in Non-English speaking countries
- Candidates are recommended to achieve above TOEFL PBT 550, CBT 210, iBT 80, TEPS 550,
 IELTS 5.5 and TOEIC (Listening & Reading 750, Speaking level 6, Writing level 7).
- For TOEIC, all three TOEIC score reports (Listening & Reading, Speaking, Writing) should be submitted.
- EPT must be taken within two years from the deadline of the online application.
- ETS can send your original copy of score report directly to KAIST admissions office. Score reports must be received by the deadline.
 - Institution Code of KAIST for TOEFL score report: 0195

7) Copy of Passport or National ID Card (copy)

· Submit a copy of your International Passport or National ID card.

Optional Materials

- 1) Honors and Awards (copy)
 - · You may submit up to five honors or awards obtained during your secondary and tertiary education.
- 2) Secondary/Tertiary School Profile (copy)
 - You may submit GPA rating system, college acceptance statistics, or other information that would help us understand your school better.

Important Notes

- 1) If any of the submitted materials contain false information, admission may be rescinded.
- 2) Candidates whose forms and supporting documents are incomplete or improper will be disqualified from the admissions process.
- 3) Submitted documents will NOT be returned in any case. Keep a copy of the completed form in case the materials get lost in the mail. Your teachers should do the same.
- 4) It is strongly recommended that all required documents be typed instead of handwritten.
- 5) After paying the application fee, you will not be able to modify your application or get a refund. Thus, carefully check what you have filled in before paying the application fee.
- 6) When asked to submit original documents, you must submit original documents.
- 7) All documents should be translated in English. The translated copy should have a seal of the institution.
- 8) Please use clips to bind the contents and do not staple the submitting materials.
- 9) The application number should be kept for further procedure such as checking the final decision.
- 10) Make sure to visit the admissions website for document arrival check (Dec. 27th ~ June 2nd). We will not contact you individually.
- 11) Admitted students may not defer enrollment to a later semester. Students who wish to defer enrollment must reapply.



Important Notes: APOSTILLE Requirements

Those who are newly admitted to KAIST should submit Apostille certificates within 15 days after they are enrolled to KAIST. Read the instruction carefully and prepare for the required certificates before you leave your country. Public documents issued by public schools or institutions such as diplomas, transcripts, etc. should attach Apostille certificates. Public documents from private schools or institutions should have notarial attestations before applying for Apostille certificates. All of the documents should be written in English or Korean. If it is written in another language, it should be translated into English or Korean and notarized by a notary office before applying for Apostille certificate.

1. What is an Apostille?

Public documents, such as birth certificates, judgments, patents or notarial attestations of signatures, frequently need to be used abroad. However, before a public document can be used in a country other than the one that issued it, its origin must often be authenticated. The traditional method for authenticating public documents to be used abroad is called legalization. For this legalization process is frequently, slow, cumbersome and costly, a large number of countries all over the world have joined a treaty that greatly simplifies the authentication of public documents to be used abroad. This treaty is called the Hague Convention of 5 October 1961 Abolishing the Requirement of Legalization for Foreign Public Documents. It is commonly known as the Apostille Convention. The treaty reduces the authentication process to a single formality: the issuance of an authentication certificate by an authority designated by the country where the public document was issued. This certificate is called an Aposille.

2. In which countries does the Apostille Convention apply?

Click <u>HERE</u> and visit Hague Conference for updated list of the countries where Apostille Convention applies.

* If your public document was issued in a country where the Apostille Convention does not apply, you should submit a Certificate of Authentication issued by the Korean Embassy or Consulate in your country.

3. Where do I get an Apostille?

Each country that is a party to the Convention must designate one or several authorities that are entitled to issue Apostilles. These authorities are called Competent Authorities – only they are permitted to issue Apostilles. Click <u>HERE</u> and visit Hague Conference to see the list of all Competent Authorities designated by each country that has joined the Apostille Convention.

4. How much does an Apostille cost?

Many Competent Authorities do charge for Apostilles. The price among Competent Authorities varies greatly. For practical information of the prices that individual countries charge, see the information available here.

[Online Application]

Q. Where can I apply to KAIST?

A. You can access http://apply.kaist.ac.kr and apply during the online application period only. Please read instructions carefully before you begin your application.

Q. I can't modify my online application. What should I do?

A. After paying the application fee, neither will you be allowed to modify your application form and nor get the fee refunded. But in case the online application is not completed or needs to be modified after the payment, please send us email (kaist.ac.kr) then we will change your payment status from "paid" to "not paid" so that you can modify your application. When you finish modifying your application form, send us email again to change your status from "not paid" to "paid". You can't modify your application on "paid" status and please check your payment status at http://apply.kaist.ac.kr. Do not pay the application fee twice.

[Academic Scores]

Q. What is the KAIST code for SAT/SAT II?

A. Institutional code is 4433.

Q. What subjects should I take in SAT II?

A. We recommend applicants to take Math L2, Physics, and Chemistry.

Q. Can I submit IGCSE and AS Level Exams as Standardized Official Test Scores?

A. No, IGCSE and AS Level Exams are not recognized as Standardized Official Test Scores. Please submit GCE A-Level Exams.

[Recommendation Letter]

Q. Can my teacher/professor send a recommendation letter directly to KAIST?

A. Yes, of course. But please note that recommendation letters should be received to Admissions Office by the deadline upon arrival.

Q. Can my teacher/professor send a recommendation letter via email?

A. Sorry, we do not accept recommendation letters via email. Letters should be signed and sealed across the back of an envelope by a recommender.

Q. I cannot get a recommendation letter from high school teacher because I graduated long time ago. What should I do?

A. You can get recommendation letters from supervisors or professors, if you are employed or studying in university. Supervisors are not required to use the letter form provided by KAIST.

Q. Should recommendation letters be typed or handwritten?

A. Both are okay but we prefer neatly typed letters.

[English Proficiency Test Report]

Q. I took TOEIC L&R but TOEIC Speaking and Writing tests are not conducted in my country. Can I submit TOEIC L&R score report without S&W?

A. TOEIC L&R scores without S&W or vice versa are considered invalid. If TOEIC S&W tests are not conducted in your country, please take TOEFL or IELTS instead.

Q. My TOEFL score has just expired, can I submit this report?

A. No, English proficiency tests should be taken two years prior to the online application deadline. If you submit the expired English test report, we consider it invalid.

Q. I got 77 scores for TOEFL internet-based, is it acceptable?

A. No, applicants must meet minimum score requirements: TOEFL 550 (210 for computer-based; 80 for internet-based), IELTS 5.5, TEPS 550, TOEIC Listening & Reading 750 + Speaking level 6 + Writing level 7 or higher.

Q. I took TOEFL this month and the result comes out after online application deadline. Can I submit TOEFL report a bit later?

A. If your TOEFL score is not announced by the online application deadline but by the

submission deadline, and then enter date of test and leave a score box blank on your online application. Only when we receive your TOEFL report within submission deadline, Admissions Office can help you to put the score in. If your score comes out after submission deadline, we cannot help you.

Q. Can I submit English proficiency test report after I accepted to KAIST?

A. No, you must submit EPT before the deadline of submission. Without EPT, your application will not be processed for review.

Q. What is KAIST reporting code for TOEFL?

Institutional code is 0915. ETS reporting takes more than three weeks so you should prepare for this in advance.

[Application Fee]

Q. Is there any possibility of waiving online application fee in certain cases?

A. No, you must pay the application fee and get an application number from Admissions Office. Or not, your application will not be processed for review even though you send your application package to Admissions Office.

Q. I paid application fee by credit card but it paid twice by mistake. Can I get a refund?

A. Please email us and inform us of your double payment then we will cancel one of the payments after checking your personal information.

[Others]

Q. I attached my CV. Can you tell me whether I am eligible for KAIST?

A. It is very difficult to predict outcomes without reviewing the completed application. In particular we cannot make a full assessment just from seeing your CV or transcript, etc.

Q. Do you admit transfer students?

A. No, we do not have transfer program for international students. You have to apply as a freshman student. We do have student exchange program, if you are interested, please contact International Relations Team. Website: http://irt.kaist.ac.kr/, Email: irt@kaist.ac.kr

Q. Are courses in KAIST taught in Korean or in English?

A. English is the medium of instruction in KAIST. Few specific courses are given in Korean but international students can substitute for others taught in English.

Q. I failed to KAIST admissions this time, when are you sending back my documents?

A. Sorry, submitted documents will NOT be returned in any case.

Q. My parents and I do not have a passport. What should I do?

A. You can submit a copy of national ID card instead of passport.

Q. I want to learn more about Korea and KAIST, is there any way?

A. You can get more information from Office of Advising & Support for International Students (OASIS) and from KAIST International Student Association (KISA) and make friends from Admissions Facebook. If you are accepted to KAIST, OASIS will match you with a senior student who is from the same country or of a similar culture and background. You may get information from the senior about studying, things to bring, food, expenses, and living in KAIST and Korea.

Q. What is the minimum score for the TOPIK or KLPT?

A. There are no minimums for the TOPIK or KLPT. TOPIK or KLPT is recommended, but not required for entrance. However, you would need to achieve TOPIK Level 2 for graduation.

Q. When is your application for prospective undergraduate program?

A. We select international undergraduate students once a year through fall admissions. We do not offer rolling admissions.

Q. May I defer my admission?

A. Requests to defer admission will not be approved. You have to reapply and take an application process again.
